Mr. Macdonald made a motion to go into Closed Session pursuant to the provisions of the Michigan Open Meetings Act, M.C.L. 15.268(1)(h), which permits a Public Body to discuss matters in closed session that are exempt by other statutes. Financial or proprietary information pertaining to a portfolio company in real estate or alternative investments in which the investment fiduciary has invested or has considered an investment that is considered by the portfolio company and acknowledged by the investment fiduciary as confidential is not subject to disclosure, noting that a roll call is required for this motion. M.C.L. 38.1140l. This is not subject to disclosure under The Freedom of Information Act, M.C.L. 15.231 et seq. The agenda item to be discussed is #5.

The Retirement Commission returned to open session at 10:28 am with the following Commissioners present: Henry Wilson, Frank Simone, Cassandra McDonald, Tom Yee, Elizabeth Misuraca, Hugh Macdonald, Alisha Bell.

Ms. McDonald moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Employees' Retirement Commission (the "Retirement Commission") is vested with the authority for the general administration, management, and operation of the Wayne County Employees' Retirement System (the "Retirement System") and has the fiduciary responsibility to invest Retirement System assets, and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission, in consultation with its Investment Consultant, has recently reviewed the Retirement System's investment portfolio and asset allocation in light of: (1) the portfolio's historical performance; (2) recent changes in the economic and financial market conditions; and (3) the Retirement Commission's goal of maximizing future gains without overly increasing risk or volatility in the portfolio, and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission is in receipt of a Letter of Intent ("LOI") from Steward Real Estate Management, LLC ("Steward") to acquire the Retirement System's interest in Steward Real Estate Fund I, L.P. ("SREP"), and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission's Investment Consultant, consistent with its role as an investment fiduciary to the Retirement System, has reviewed the terms of the LOI and conducted appropriate due diligence and has presented the Retirement Commission with a recommendation,

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of its Investment Consultant and the completion of its due diligence, the Retirement Commission desires to accept the LOI from Steward, therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the Wayne County Employees' Retirement Commission, to <u>Accept</u> the offer from Steward in the LOI and to sell the Retirement System's interest in SREP to Steward, subject to legal review of a Purchase Agreement by the Retirement Commission's designated legal counsel, VanOverbeke, Michaud & Timmony, P.C., to review, and further

RESOLVED, by the Wayne County Employees' Retirement Commission, to $\underline{\text{Authorize}}$ the Chair or Vice Chair to execute the Purchase Agreement.

The motion was supported by Mr. Yee and carried unanimously 7-0.

8. Consideration of a verbal report from Committee Chair, Hugh Macdonald regarding the Audit Committee meeting of September 15, 2022.

Mr. Macdonald moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLVED, by the Wayne County Employees' Retirement Commission, to <u>Accept</u> the verbal report from Committee Chair, Hugh Macdonald regarding the Audit Committee meeting of September 15, 2022.

The motion was supported by Mr. Yee and carried unanimously 6-0-1 with Mr. Simone abstaining. (Mr. Simone abstained as he was absent from the meeting)

9. Consideration of a recommendation from the Audit Committee regarding the responses for the Custodial Banking Services RFP.

Mr. Macdonald moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission of the Wayne County Employees' Retirement System (the "Retirement Commission") is vested with the fiduciary responsibility for the proper administration, management and operation of the Retirement System, and for making effective the Retirement System provisions, and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission notes the provisions of Section 141-35(f)(5) of the Retirement Ordinance and Section 13(5) of Public Act 314 of 1965, as amended [MCL 38.1133(5)], authorize the Retirement Commission to use a portion of the Retirement System's income to defray the costs of investing, managing, and protecting the assets of the system, as well as retaining the services necessary for the conduct of the affairs of the system, including investment advisors and consultants, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its Service Provider Review Policy, the Retirement Commission periodically reviews the performance, cost, and services offered by its Professional Service Providers; and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission conducts due diligence on its Professional Service Providers by analyzing and comparing both existing and prospective Professional Service Providers by methods including, but not limited to, comparing formal proposals; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its Service Provider Review Policy, the Retirement Commission desired to conduct due diligence on its custodian bank by issuing the RFP for Custodian Banking Services; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the review process outlined in Section 10(c) of the Retirement Commission's Rule of Procedure, the Executive Director, with assistance from the Retirement Commission's legal counsel and investment consultant, drafted a Request for Proposals ("RFP") for Custodial Banking Services, and

WHEREAS, at its March 22, 2022, meeting, the Audit Committee reviewed the RFP and adopted a resolution recommending that the RFP for Custodial Banking Services be approved and issued by the Retirement Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission issued the Custodial Banking Services RFP on Monday, March 28, 2022, with responses due to the Retirement System by Friday, May 17, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. local time (EST); and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission referred consideration of the RFP responses to the Audit Committee which will, in consultation with the Executive Director in accordance with Section 10(d) of the Rules of Procedure, review the responses and submit a recommendation to the Retirement Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Audit Committee designated a Trustees and members of staff to review the responses to the RFP, and

WHEREAS, after thorough review and discussion, the Audit Committee recommended three finalists to the Retirement Commission for further consideration, and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission has thoroughly reviewed and discussed the custodial banking services provided by the respondents, and

WHEREAS, the Retirement Commission is of the considered opinion that it is in the best interest of the Members, Beneficiaries, and Participants for the Retirement Commission to retain the services of the Northern Trust Company as the Retirement System's Custodial Bank, and

WHEREAS, Northern Trust has represented that it is empowered and authorized to provide the services contained in its RFP response, therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the Wayne County Employees' Retirement Commission, that in accordance with the provisions of the Plan and in consideration of its response to the RFP and



the due diligence of the Audit Committee, the Retirement Commission <u>Approves</u> the Northern Trust Company's proposal to continue to provide custodial banking services, and be it further

RESOLVED, by the Wayne County Employees' Retirement Commission, the Retirement Commission's designated legal counsel, VanOverbeke, Michaud & Timmony, P.C., is <u>Authorized</u> to review and negotiate any necessary contractual documents, and be it further

RESOLVED, by the Wayne County Employees' Retirement Commission, that the Chair, Vice Chair and Executive Director are <u>Authorized</u> to execute the any necessary contractual documents to retain the services of Northern Trust, and be it further

RESOLVED, by the Wayne County Employees' Retirement Commission, that a copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to Northern Trust and all other appropriate parties.

The motion was supported by Mr. Simone and carried unanimously 7-0.
